Advice Centre

The No Limits Advice Centre is a friendly 'one stop shop' where young people can come to get help with any issues they may be facing. No appointment is needed, you can drop into our Advice Centre whenever we are open.

Issues we can help with include emotional wellbeing, homelessness, relationships, sexual health, sexuality, alcohol and drugs, mental health issues, domestic violence or abuse, education, employment, money advice or anything else you want help with.

Eligibility criteria: 13-25 or under 13 with parental permission

Breakout Youth

Breakout Youth is an independent charity (no. 1180296) based in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. Offering confidential support service for young people aged 11 to 25, who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning or unsure of their sexuality or gender identity.

Bright Beginnings

Bright Beginnings works with young parents to help them, and their baby, live a happy and healthy life. Support is delivered by volunteer mentors (called befrienders) or by No Limits Youth Workers to help young parents who are isolated and do not have a lot of support in facing the challenges of being a young parent.

Our befrienders will meet with the young parent regularly and offer support with anything they may be struggling with, particularly concerning the health of parent and baby or any questions they may have about being a parent.

Community Counselling

No Limits Counselling

Our team of friendly, experienced counsellors will support young people with anything they may be facing.

Counselling is an opportunity to talk to someone in confidence about anything that might be worrying them. This could be about home life, school, college, relationships or just about how they may be feeling about themselves.

Our counselling is Southampton based.

Children's Counselling for 5-10 year olds: Delivered in schools, at the No Limits Head Office or via Zoom. Referrals are only accepted from a Southampton based GP or the Solent NHS School Nursing team.

Counselling for ages 11-17 years (24 for care leavers and SEND) We offer specific timeslots for you to call and discuss counselling. These are 6-7:30pm every Wednesday and 12-4pm every Friday. This initial call will help determine the best way to support you.

HYA (Hampshire Youth Access) Counselling (Hampshire and Portsmouth)

Hampshire Youth Access (HYA) is a partnership of 11 leading agencies providing counselling, information, advice, and support to children and young people aged 5-17 (or 24 for care leavers and SEND) across Hampshire and Portsmouth.

We also give advice and information to anyone concerned about a child or young person's emotional wellbeing.

The HYA team also provides therapeutic groups or 1:1 support with a Youth Wellbeing Practitioner designed to give young people practical support with their emotional health and wellbeing. See the website for further details.

Community Support

Community Support Youth Workers help young people with maintaining their tenancy, settling into new accommodation and preventing young people becoming homeless. Community Support Youth Workers can see you in your home, in the community or from our Advice Centre in Southampton.

We can support with a range of housing problems including rent arrears, issues with landlords, maintenance and repairs, receiving an eviction notice or anything else that affects a young person's tenancy.

COSMO

COSMO (children of substance misusing others) is a support group for children and young people who are affected by the substance use of their friends or family. It is a safe space for them to relax, have fun and meet other young people going through similar experiences. COSMO runs during school holidays and sessions are full of activities to take part in, such as arts and crafts, sport, cooking, theatre, music and day trips out.

Eligibility criteria: Aged 11-18 and living in Southampton

DASH

(Drug & Alcohol, Support Hub)

DASH is a service for young people under the age of 25 who would like support with their drugs or alcohol use.

The DASH team can provide a wide range of information, advice, support and counselling around any substances they may be using, their effects and risks, as well as how to stay safe.

Eligibility criteria: Aged up to 25 years and living in Southampton

Emergency Department & 111

Emergency Department

The No Limits ED Youth Worker service provides support in the emergency departments across 5 Southampton, Hampshire, Portsmouth and IOW hospitals. Our team of ED Youth Workers are committed to empowering children and young people to achieve positive changes in their lives. Our unique service delivery model aims to support all children and young people who attend the ED in crisis, whether that is through violent crime or mental health crisis. Our team works within the 'reachable moment' when a young person attends ED in crisis to help them to start thinking about change. This service provides direct support to children and young people in the emergency department and in the community. By helping the young person to connect with specialist support and other community services through Social Prescribing.

Eligibility criteria: Aged 11-25, attending an Emergency Department for treatment, assessment or care

111

We work in partnership with the 111 Mental Health team to support 11–25-year-olds across Hampshire who are accessing 111 for advice and support with their Mental Health and Wellbeing. As Social Prescribers we offer one to one support where we link young people to local services and offer support to engage with those services to help improve their wellbeing. Social prescribing aims to connect children and young people to community groups, education and employment opportunities, and statutory services for practical and emotional support.

Emotional Resilience

Emotional Resilience is an 9-week group for young people living in the SO14-SO19 postcode. This group covers understanding and identifying emotions, the responses to stress and physical effects of emotions, negative thinking, triggers, self-esteem, and self-compassion. It is a safe place to meet people with similar feelings and experiences.

Eligibility criteria: 11 to 25 and living in Southampton

Referral waiting time: Courses run every 10 weeks or so and are split by age groups. Get in touch to find out more.

Health and wellbeing drop-ins (Schools and Colleges)

No Limits runs weekly health and well-being drop-in sessions at secondary schools, and bi-weekly sessions in colleges across, Southampton throughout term time. These run for 30-120 minutes and are in the same place each week.

Look out for the friendly No Limits staff in black t-shirts or ask your tutor where to find the sessions. **Eligibility criteria:** Aged 11 to 25 and attending a school or college that we work with, in Southampton.

Help can include: Emotional wellbeing, relationships, income and budgeting, accessing support from other agencies, school or education, employment, consumer rights, community issues, money or debt advice, personal development or anything else you want help with.

Primary Mental Health Workers (PMHW)

Mental Health primary care for 18-to-25-year old's supporting with one to one or group work over 6 targeted interventions delivered at No Limits sites and in the community.

Safe Havens

Our Safe Havens offer support services across Southampton, Northeast Hampshire and the Isle of Wight, for young people who are experiencing difficulties with their mental health and who need access to out of hours emotional and practical support. Confidential advice online, over the telephone and in open-access drop-in centres to talk about anything they may be going through. Our Youth Workers will support young people in a safe space, helping them to make positive changes to their mental health and well-being, as well as signpost to other sources of support. **Eligibility criteria:** Differ by location. Safe House

Safe House is a weekly peer support group for young people aged 16-25 who have lived experiences of mental health. The sessions are an opportunity to make friends with other young people who may be in a similar situation.

Safe House works on a supportive peer mentor model of working. It may be social, emotional or practical support but importantly this support is mutually offered and reciprocal, allowing peers to benefit from the support whether they are giving or receiving it.

Eligibility criteria: Aged 16 to 25 living in Southampton (SO14-SO19 postcodes)

Sexual Health

Our Sexual Health Youth Workers work in partnership with Solent NHS and deliver "Let's Talk" RSE, Peer Education to schools and colleges across Hampshire. They deliver RSE workshops and assemblies, attend events across Hampshire providing Sexual Health information and Advice. In addition, every Thursday we run a free **sexual health clinic** where a specialist sexual health nurse offers sexual health advice as well as all forms of contraception, including; injections and implants, screening for STIs, treatments for STIs, Condoms and Pregnancy testing. Condoms, STI testing and pregnancy testing is also available through our health and wellbeing drop-ins in schools and colleges.

SHINE is a group for young people who identify themselves as female.

Teen Safe House

Teen Safe House is a support group for young people suffering from confidence or anxiety issues. This can be anything from feeling different, invisible, misunderstood, hearing voices, depressed, struggling to cope, lonely, wanting to self-harm, stressed, anxious.

Time4U

Time4U are support groups for young people with a learning disability and whose parents/carers are registered and have a MaxCard+ (register through the Buzz Network). Sessions run weekly in a central location, providing the opportunity to meet with likeminded young people, make friends, have fun and talk about things that are important to them.

Eligibility criteria: Aged 8 to 18 (run as 2 groups – aged 8-12 and 11-18), must have a Max+ card Referral waiting time: None

Young Carers in Southampton

Young Carers in Southampton is a project for children and young people whose lives are affected by caring for an unwell or disabled family member.

A young carer is a child or young person who cares for a person who may have a physical or learning disability, mental health support needs, chronic illness or have difficulties with drug/alcohol use.

We offer information, advice and support around being a young carer, in addition to weekly group sessions and respite activities that will give young carers the opportunity to meet and make friends with other young carers who are in a similar situation to them.

Eligibility criteria: Aged 8 to 18 living in Southampton (we also accept referrals you attend a school/college in Southampton but don't live in SO14 -SO19 postcode.)

Referral waiting time: Approximate wait time for assessment - 2 month
